My monograph *Early Medieval Chants from Nonantola: Sequences*, was published in 1999 by A-R Editions in their series Recent Researches in the Music of the Middle Ages and Early Renaissance, Volume 33. I supervised a recording by the Schola Hungarica of selected works from this edition, issued [Quint recordings, 903084].
